Leviticus and the Sacrificial System Lesson 9 – Appointed Times, Feasts, Sacred Days

Text

Leviticus 23; Exodus 12:2-14; 20:8-11; 31:12-17; Deut 16:1-16; 26:1-10

Introduction

Leviticus 23 lists the appointed times, feasts, and sacred days for the people. These times are considered as a Holy Convocation (sacred assembly). The Sabbath, listed separately, is a weekly observance. All the others are observed annually based on the Hebrew Calendar. There are two new years in the Hebrew calendar, religious and civil. Based upon Ex 12:2, Abib/Nisan is the first month, but the Jewish civil New Year is celebrated in the seventh month of Tishri with the Feast of Trumpets.

Not everyone agrees on that actual number of these special times. Not counting the Sabbath, there are generally considered to be seven of these special times. Some consider the Passover and Feast of Unleavened bread to be a single feast, and others add the feast of firstfruits to that. Some count the last day of the feast of booths (tabernacles) as a separate day, making the total eight. For this lesson, we will assume that there will be eight plus the Sabbath.

Other Special Times

Two other feasts not mentioned in Leviticus are Purim and Hanukkah (Feast of Dedication, Festival of Lights). These are celebrated but were never commanded by the LORD.
